Do you want to be a community activist and help scientists learn about the state of frogs and toads across our region?

Monroe County Parks and Recreation invites you to participate in a two-part training workshop on March 26 and 27. The workshop will explore the value of wetlands, learn some of the reasons for the current crisis of amphibian decline, teach how to identify frogs by their calls, and train participants to monitor frogs and toads at a location they choose.

Workshop participants will learn about how they can participate in Frogwatch USA, sponsored by the AZA (Association of Zoos and Aquariums), to gather information about frogs and toads in south-central Indiana and support protection of these environmentally sensitive species and their habitat. **No prior experience is necessary.** We will provide the training and resources.
